



THE NICENE CREED

Said by all, standing. It is customary to bow at the underlined words.

I BELIEVE in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible;

And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of his Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God, begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father; by whom all things were made; who for us men and for our salvation came down from heaven, and was incarnate by the Holy Ghost of the Virgin Mary, and was made man; and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate; he suffered and was buried; and the third day he rose again according to the Scriptures, and ascended into heaven, and sitteth on the right hand of the Father; and he shall come again, with glory, to judge both the quick and the dead; whose kingdom shall have no end.

And I believe in the Holy Ghost, the Lord, and Giver of Life, who proceedeth from the Father and the Son; who with the Father and the Son together is worshipped and glorified; who spake by the Prophets.

And I believe one holy Catholic and Apostolic Church; I acknowledge one Baptism for the remission of sins; and I look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

THE COMMISSIONING OF A NEW WARDEN AND VESTRY MEMBERS

The Celebrant addresses the Congregation

BROTHERS and Sisters in Christ Jesus, we are all baptized by the one Spirit into one Body, and given gifts for a variety of ministries for the common good. Our purpose is to commission these persons in the Name of God and of this congregation to the ministries to which they are called.

The Current Warden and the Retiring Warden present the new Warden and new members of the Vestry. The Celebrant says

Are these persons you are to present prepared by a commitment to Christ as Lord, by regular attendance at worship, and by the knowledge of their duties, to exercise their ministry to the honor of God, and the well-being of this Church?

Presenters I believe they are.

The Celebrant then addresses the newly elected Warden and members of the Vestry

You have been called to a ministry in this congregation. Will you, as long as you are engaged in this work, perform it with diligence?

Answer I will.

Celebrant Will you faithfully and reverently execute the duties of your ministry to the honor of

God, and the benefit of the members of this congregation?

Answer I will.

The Presenters say

We present to you Gregory Zaffiro to be admitted to the ministry of Warden, and Samyel Lee, John Oghia, Benita Potters, and Karl Saunders to be admitted to the ministry of Member of the Vestry in this congregation.

Celebrant The Lord giveth wisdom, out of his mouth cometh knowledge and understanding.

People He layeth up sound wisdom for the righteous, he is a buckler to them that walk

rightly.

Celebrant I am thy servant, O grant me understanding:

People That I may know thy testimonies.

Celebrant Let us pray.

ETERNAL God, the foundation of all wisdom and the source of all courage: Enlighten with thy grace the Wardens and Vestry of this congregation, and so rule their minds, and guide their counsels, that in all things they may seek thy glory and promote the mission of thy Church; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Candidates are individually received to their office.

In the Name of God and of this congregation, I commission you, Gregory, as a Warden in this Parish.

The Celebrant blesses the Warden's medal.

Let us pray.

GOD, whose blessed Son hath sanctified and transfigured the use of material things: Receive this medal which we offer unto thee, and grant that it may proclaim thy love, benefit thy Church, and minister grace and joy to the one who shall wear it; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The outgoing Warden vests the newly elected warden with the medal. The Celebrant then receives the new members of the Vestry in turn.

In the Name of God and of this congregation, I commission you, [Samyel, John, Benita, Karl] as a Member of the Vestry in this Parish.

The People stand, and the Celebrant concludes the ceremony with this prayer

Let us pray.

A LMIGHTY and everlasting God, by whose Spirit the whole body of thy faithful people is governed and sanctified: Receive our supplications and prayers, which we offer before thee for all members of thy holy Church, that in their vocation and ministry they may truly and devoutly serve thee; through our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, who liveth and reigneth with thee, in the unity of the same Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.



The People remain kneeling until the bell rings.

AN ACT OF SPIRITUAL COMMUNION (for those unable to receive Holy Communion)

BELIEVE in thee, O my Jesus, present in the most holy Sacrament of the Altar; I love thee above all things, and I desire to receive thee into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive thee sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace thee, and I unite myself to thee as if thou wast already there. Never permit me to be separated from thee!

O Lord Jesus Christ, let the sweet and consuming force of thy love absorb my whole soul, that I may die for the love of thee, who wast pleased to die for the love of me. Amen.


