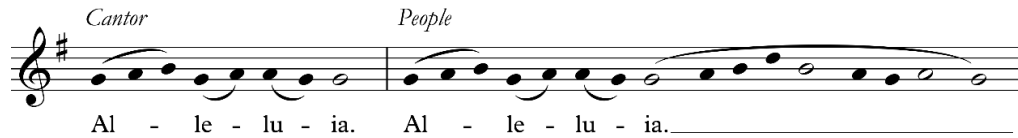

Since I cannot at this moment receive thee sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart.
