

ADMISSION OF NEW CHORISTERS

The Choir and Ministers stand; the People remain seated.

The Head of School presents the Probationers for admission to the Rector, saying

Reverend Father, I present to you Jacob, Jayden, and Lorenzo to be admitted as Choristers of this Church of Saint Thomas Fifth Avenue.

The Rector asks the Boys to be admitted the following

Do you desire to be admitted a Chorister of this Church?

The Boys answer

I do.

Taking each Probationer's hand in turn, the Rector says

In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, I admit you, *N.*, as a Chorister of this Church. **Amen**.

The Director of Music vests the new Chorister with a surplice and then hands to the Rector a Hymnal.

The Rector hands the Hymnal to the newly admitted Chorister, saying

Remember always that what you sing with your lips, you should believe in your heart, and what you believe in your heart, you should practice in your life. **Amen**.

When all have been admitted, the Head and Deputy Head Chorister take each newly admitted Chorister, in turn, to his place in the Choir stalls and say,

Pursuant to a decree of the Venerable Rector and Vestry of Saint Thomas Church Fifth Avenue, we install you, N., as a Chorister of this Church.

When all have been installed, the Head and Deputy Head Chorister take their places in the Choir stalls.

The Rector says

Let us pray.

The People stand.

A LMIGHTY and everlasting God, who makes us both to will and to do those things that are good and acceptable unto thee: We offer our prayers to thee for thy servants here present, and more especially for them who have now been admitted to a place in the Choir of this Church. Let thy fatherly hand ever be over them; let thy Holy Spirit ever be with them; and so lead them in the knowledge and obedience of thy holy word that, in the end, they may obtain everlasting life; through our Lord Jesus Christ, who with thee and the Holy Spirit liveth and reigneth ever, one God, world without end. Amen.


The People remain standing for the Office Hymn and Magnificat.

THE COLLECT FOR PEACE



THE COLLECT FOR AID AGAINST ALL PERILS




